The Intervenors<sup>1</sup> respectfully submit a proposed remedial map of congressional districts pursuant to the third paragraph of the Supreme Court's Order of January 22, 2018. The third paragraph provides that the Intervenors may submit a proposed remedial districting plan by February 15, 2018, should the General Assembly not submit a map or should the Governor not approve a map submitted by the General Assembly.

The remedial map proposed by the Intervenor splits only 13 counties, with nine counties split into two congressional districts, and 4 split into three districts. No counties are split into more than three districts.

The remedial map proposed by the Intervenor splits only 16 municipalities and 32 voting districts, to adjust the populations of the congressional districts. No voting district is split more than once.
